Scouts grouped, flags raised, air horn sounded, our long anticipated Sixth Annual Athletics meet began on 30th November. While everyone took their seats, the microphone delivered the first surprise of the day.

I was expecting long jump and high jump when "This is the first call for girls A grade 1500 meters race" shocked many. For a person who rarely trains for long distances, what followed was simply a toil. Nonetheless, I managed to survive and regained my breath an hour later, from which I went about my job (this article!).

Most Houses started the day with confidence. Priest House, defending their glory last year, were thought to have a 60% chance of winning the overall championship while the three-time winner King House predicted 110%. Christ house guessed at 200% and Saviour 100%.

As for the cheering competition, all Houses got their marks deducted prior to the day. In an effort to make sense of the situation, I put the House Committees through my investigation. But one point was unanimously agreed, it was a hot day.



ENGLISH DEBATING

It has been another busy term for our English Debaters . The Debate Team has now both Junior and Senior sections with Glenn Li now assuming the role of Junior Team Chairperson and Jessica Tam as overall President of the Club. The Seniors were invited by South Island International School to participate in a World Schools' style competition involving leading international and local schools in September . This was a great experience and a great challenge for them. The Seniors also were able to reach the quarter finals of the NESTA Hong Kong Schools' Competition where they were defeated by Pui Tak Canossian College. However, they won their previous five rounds and defeated schools such as Heep Yunn and Shatin Government Secondary School on the way. Recently they also won their first round of the Sing Tao Competition and will meet Queen Elizabeth School in the next round at the end of January. Our junior debaters have been very active with a number of training sessions where S3 members have been teaching new members, including S1 students, the basics of debating. The juniors also presented two demonstration debates for parents on the school's recent "Open Days". The debaters performed very well and the debates were very well received by parents.

Students are developing and progressing, enjoying their activities and learning a very important lesson that: "Debating is for Life!"

SPKC Students Present Programme on RTHK3's "Teen Time"

Recently four S6 students Hugo Lai, Nikki Chung, Jeremy Lam and Sam Chung presented a programme on " Poverty in Hong Kong" on the popular "Teen Time with Alyson Hau" programme broadcast on RTHK3. The programme also marked the culmination of an English project on the ' Poverty" theme undertaken by both S 6 classes where students researched, wrote about, created and performed activities to raise awareness of this vital issue. The SPKC programme was first broadcast on December 1 this year and will be held on the "Teen Time" archive for one year . Mock Trial

The English Department has recruited 12 students from our school to join the English Mock Trial Competition organized by the Joint School Mock Trial Club. Our team will be competing with students from the most prestigious and renowned schools in Hong Kong, including Diocesan Girls' School, St. Paul's Convent School, St Mary's Canossian College and Cheung Chuk Shan College.

The Mock Trail Competition offers a stimulating opportunity for students to enrich their English learning experiences practising their thinking, reading, writing, listening and speaking skills through court case analysis, case preparation and role-play. In addition to English language practice, students will gain a better understanding of key legal concepts and values related to the common law trial process. .Training workshops will be held before the competition led by practising lawyers and lecturers from Law Faculties from universities in Hong Kong

Students will be given a fictitious criminal trial case file containing witness statements and other relevant materials. They will work together to prepare a memorandum of advice on the strength of the case, conduct research on a legal topic and prepare a written research report. Finally, they will

perform a role-play assigning fellow team members to portray witnesses and courtroom lawyers for either the prosecution or the defense in a mock trial of the case. The Mock Trial Club gives a great opportunity for SPKC to showcase its talents competing with best schools in Hong Kong.

Mr. Li, how much freedom did you have when you were studying aboard? What do you think about it in retrospect?

I lived in the dorms and later moved out with some friends, so I would say I had a lot of freedom. It teaches one a lot about responsibilities because you'd have to make your own decisions on all the daily matters and you'd have to bear the consequences. Some lessons were learnt in rather painful experience I admit! I'd say, leaving your friends and familiar environment may not the easiest thing. But if you have a chance to consider studying aboard, do go for it! Seize the chance to broaden your horizon.

Tung, how would you describe the city you live in? Do you think the overseas study experience is different now compared to the time when you were a student overseas?

Vancouver is very multicultural, very hybrid — two of my best friends from high school were from Iran and Russia (on my left and right in the picture). People in schools were a mix of locals, immigrants, and international students from all over the world. I noticed that nowadays many overseas alumni return home one or more times every year, which is very different than my experience. I did not return Hong Kong during the first three years of my stay in Vancouver. However, It made the returning experience later more culturally stimulating — the separation allowed me to think about Hong Kong from a different perspective after not being part of it for a while.





Ms. Tang, what do you think about Hong Kong students? What would you like to encourage them with your experience?

I feel very strongly that Hong Kong students should try to make friends with people from other countries and cultures. It is a world of people of different colors and races, uniquely brought up by different backgrounds and languages. You will learn to respect different cultures when you open up your relationships with people from outside your own culture; and that will open up your mind a lot in return.

Ms. Yeung, how does your overseas studying experience affect you as a teacher in a local secondary school now?

The intercultural experience had a great impact on my teaching in English and Humanities subjects, on which the British education has strong emphasis. English and IH are essential tools that help us understand ourselves and the world, they're about appreciation, application and passion. My goal is to infuse these positive values in my teaching, but not sacrificing the important elements in traditional Chinese education.



Updates from Ms. Christine Wong

Ms. Wong, taking on her own "learning without walls", has left us to further her studies in Norway this year.

Where are you studying now?

Tromsoe, Norway, in University of Tromsoe.

What did the school experience teach you about learning?

I have not finished the Master's programme yet, but it is a great experience. Education in Norway does not emphasize on competition, but co-operation. You learn most from others.

What's the one thing which you'd show SPKC students if they were to visit the neighborhood you lived in/your school? The supermarkets. There aren't many salmon and they are extremely expensive, so stop asking me for salmon.



How is your experience in Norway as a student, so far?

I have been comparing Norwegian people with other European people, they are really nice. They smile; they are not as cold as the weather. The classes are much smaller. There are only 6 students in my class. However, since what I am taking is a Master's programme, I mostly need to work more on my own. It would be impossible to rely on the teachers to tell you everything. Also, now I have more free time. I can shut myself in my room and start writing my papers anytime. Entertainment here is not like Hong Kong's. I found myself able to concentrate on my studies better.

Visiting the Animated Version of the "RIVERSIDE SCENE ON QING MING FESTIVAL"

(8 November 2010)







Zhang Zeduan's "Riverside Scene on Qing Ming Festival" is a well-known national treasure and a beautiful masterpiece. It is beyond a doubt one of the top ten most famous Chinese historical paintings. Besides its extremely high artistic value, this picture possesses a tremendously important historic value, due to its vivid depiction of civilian life of different social classes in Bianjing and in the suburbs during the Qingming Festival during the Song Dynasty.

This Animated Version of "Riverside Scene of the Qing Ming Festival" has incorporated top of the line animation technology. Most of our teachers and students did not have the chance to admire this wonderful creation at the Shanghai World Expo 2010. We were all excited to visit the AsiaWorld Expo to take a look at this magnificent creation.

With the cooperation of the Visual Arts Department, Liberal Studies Depart-

ment, Chinese History Department and Other Learning Experiences Working Group of our school, 320 teachers and students visited the exhibition and learned about the visual and historical aspects of the painting.

Supervising teachers explained to the students and teacher participants about the historical, cultural and artistic values of the painting before the visit. Cities in the Song Dynasty underwent drastic changes when compared with those in the previous times. And yet there were many business activities and people enjoyed a diversified cultural life.

From an aesthetic perspective, the painter has used a painting skill called scatter perspective which is a significant painting technique in Chinese painting. It also exhibits the riverside scene with a 'walking method'. When you first walk in and see the painting, it is the countryside. Then as you are moving along, you can see what the

city looks like from the countryside towards the city center.

This animated version of the painting shows us the advanced progress of technological development in modern China. Computer animation gives life to characters and objects in the painting. An integrated image is formed by several high resolution projectors using sophisticated computer geometric transformation and correction technology. The scene is portrayed in day and night cycles lasting for four minutes with dramatic interplay of light and color.

This is an invaluable experience for students to learn more about the social and economic life, and the aesthetic development in the Song Dynasty as well as the application of advanced technology in modern China. In the end, students and teachers found the visit meaningful and educational.


Boys and girls, they can be applied to our own life and inspire us to do better! I hope you can take a first step and taste the fun of reading and greatness through biographies.
