為了讓同學多角度認識三月十一日日本大地震及核災難，通識教育科、地理科、可持續發展組以及課程及全人發展委員會聯合舉行壁報展覽，分別展示了大地震及核事故的最新消息、地震及海嘯的形成、核能發電的原理以及香港核能的發展情況。

除此之外，為配合通識教育科「能源科技與環境」的主題，老師鼓勵同學就地震事件及未來香港使用核能發電的發展作反思，以下是部分同學的意見：



題目：

你同意香港於2020年把核電的發電比例提升至50%嗎？

在上一個行政年度，香港政府提議在2020年調整香港發電燃料組合，把核電比例提升逾倍至50%，以達致一個環保發電的目標，我並不同意香港於2020年把核電發電比例提升至50%。

首先，是核能安全性的問題。在香港建造核電站是一個十分危險的建設，剛剛發生的日本地震，導致四組核電設施過熱爆炸，方圓十里的人民也要撤離，政府並已公布在核電站周圍地方的幅射含量已經達到嚴重階段。雖然香港很少會發生地震，但一個再先進的國家也會出錯，誰知道冷卻設施突然失靈，導致和日本相同的爆炸，一陣風已足以把那些有害物質飄到全城，所以我們應該以史為鑑，在不幸事件發生前去阻止，否則後果會變得十分嚴重。

第二，香港根本沒有必要急於發展核能。香港的地皮有限，不能夠仿效歐美等國家般建造大型的環保發電設施，例如太陽能和風能等，表面上香港有能力發展的清潔能源只有核能一種，但當我們想深一層

，香港的問題不是單靠香港自己去面對的，我們還有一個擁有豐富天然資源的祖國——中國。中國地大物博，資源多的是，加上近年中國的能源科技技術慢慢成熟起來，中國接二連三的發現新油田和油井，並且中國為了幫助香港，不惜工本專程建造一條管道把中國西邊的天然氣運到香港，香港根本沒有必要急於在本地使用核能。我們現在還未去到一個能源資短缺的時期，如果在一個還有穩定供應能源的年代，我覺得我們應該先選擇先用一些比較安全的能源。

第三，是政府想發展清潔能源，核能不是唯一的方法，香港在中環等商業區會找到大部分的高樓大廈，其實如果政府願意花點資源，在那些天台發展太陽能，又是一種發電的方法，問題只是政府能否願意投入資源去研究和發展，何不先考慮一些安全和較受歡迎的能源呢？

總括以上原因，我們反對在2020年把核電的發電比例提升至50%。

Poverty Week

(11 - 15 April 2011)

Character Building Team has actively encouraged students to reflect and to respond to social issues in order to build their sense of civic responsibility. The theme of this year's Poverty Week is "Poverty has its reason, wealth has its responsibility" and we focused on the topic of how legalizing minimum wage will affect the lives of grass-root Hong Kong citizens. We have organized a series of activities according to this theme including Poverty Forum, Teacher's Charity Auction, Poverty Game Stalls and a sharing session of the "Elderly Visit in Kwong Yuen Estate Scheme" for S.4 students.

First, we have issued a "Pooi Kei Daily" to give the students a general idea and different views in the society about legalizing minimum wage. Then in the "Poverty Forum", student representatives and the audiences were separated into four groups and played the roles of "Government", "Incorporated Enterprises", "Small Businesses" and "Grass-root Labors". These four stakeholders have discussed and argued the pros and cons of legalizing minimum wage. Students have the chance to explore and discuss the issue not only in the view of the grass-root labors

(i.e. the general public) but also the views of other different parties to fully understand the dilemma of this current issue.

To fully grasp the idea of how much \$28 is worth, we have talked about the price of groceries nowadays and let students guess the price of each item. Our teachers have donated a number of items for the "Teacher's Charity Auction". Also, we have asked students to donate money if they want to help the people in need. Students were generous enough to donate or bid more than \$6,000. All proceeds and donations were given to the food bank of St. James's Settlement.

Finally, we have continued the "Elderly Visit in Kwong Yuen Estate Scheme" started last year. S.4 students of each class have visited elderly who lives alone in not only Kwong Yuen Estate. Students have prepared some small gifts for the elderly to show their love and care. After all the visits, we had a sharing session on Poverty Week to let students reflect their act of kindness and what they have learnt in the process.

Mock Trial Club

This year, our English Department has enrolled a team of 12 students in the Joint School Mock Trial Competition organized by Joint School Mock Trial Club. Our team is made of students from 55 and 56 and this is the first time they have entered the competition. Students were given fictitious criminal trial case files containing witness statements and other relevant materials. They needed to work together to prepare a memorandum of advice on the strength of the case, conduct a research on a legal topic and prepare a written research report. Finally, they performed role plays assigning fellow team members to portray witnesses and courtroom lawyers for either the prosecution or the defence in a mock trial of the case.

There were altogether 12 participating schools, including prestigious schools like Diocesan Girls' School and Maryknoll Convent School. Our school defeated American International School and St. Stephen's Girls' College in the first round. We successfully entered the quarter-finals and obtained the third position in the first round. Angel Lam So Yan from 6J obtained the Best Lawyer Award twice and she also won the 2nd runner up of the Best Lawyer Award for the overall competition. Also, Yvonne Yu from 6J and Hugo Lai from 6F won the Best Lawyer and Best Witness Awards respectively. Though our team could not make it to the semi-final, our students have made remarkable progress and achievement in the process. Not only do they stretch their English competency through their conscientious preparation and practice, their English learning experience is also enriched. Our team has demonstrated excellent team work and the friendship they have built with fellow team members and teachers is the most valuable.

Our annual Readathon programme is another highlight for this year. After a school-wide vote, students have chosen Hong Kong Children's Cancer Fund to be the target charity of our Readathon, which will benefit with more than HK\$12,000 raised.
