The dance club has hit their goals by getting prizes in *The 49th Schools Dance Festival* (Jazz) and *The 41st Open Dance Contest* (Jazz). Ms. Diana Chung, the teacher in charge of the club, was pleased with the performance of the club at this stage and is optimistic about the prospects of the club.

Ms. Chung was the teacher-manager of the dancing team in her previous school, and therefore she is experienced in organizing and dealing with various problems experienced by the club. At that time, she set up goals for the team, and achieved them every year, up until the year she left, they almost always got every prize they wanted. She hopes she could do the same with this school's dance club. What they have done and received recently means that they have achieved the first step towards their target.

Not at all like other competitions with exclusive prizes, the competitions that the dance club are participating in comprised various prizes to cater for teams or clubs with different levels and skills. Accordingly, teams or clubs have better chance to earn a prize. Similar to computer games, players achieve their goals step by step, the difficulties go up with increasing levels. As long as the players keep attaining the goals, their skills will improve. This rationale benefits players as it enables them to gain their sense of accomplishment effortlessly. This analogy could concretely expound the rationales and the positive repercussions behind the competition.

The dance club of our school mainly focuses on the thematic dance, which is a type of dance with themes and messages behind and throughout the plot. Dancers involved in a particular dance do not share the same movement, instead, each dancer has their own role and movements, outpouring their own emotions, with collaboration between dancers, unique patterns will be formed.

Ms. Chung is pleased with the team members' performances. She has said that members in the club are hardworking and devoted to dance, therefore, they have received heartening results on their first step.

Difficulties and limitations

Hiring a suitable tutor was a difficulty in setting up a dance club. With Ms. Chung's experience, she noticed that the tutor of the club should not be too strict, or connive with members, otherwise, members wouldn't find it interesting and would either leave the club or just become desultory in lessons. Fortunately, she recruited a benevolent tutor who is eager to instruct in the dance club of our school and made it his first priority in his schedule. Another difficulty owed to members' attendance. Ms. Chung explained that members of this school are always busy, especially during holidays. If there are not enough members attending a class, it is not possible to practice in choreography even if the teachers and tutors are present, the class should be cancelled. Hence, extra classes should be added before competitions. The classes added should also be accommodating to all members, so that members could be familiar with their movements.

Limitation of budget is also a difficulty. As most of the budget is retrieved from the

club fee, the budget set should be careful enough in order to operate practices and to purchase suitable costumes. If members are not performing well, extra classes should be added so that members can be familiar with the dance. The extra classes cost more in hiring the tutor, which may add a burden to the club's budget.

Despite the difficulties which have emerged in the establishment of the club,

they have received support, especially from our school, which has driven up their morale. Ms. Chung has depicted that the support from the school was overwhelming. She is grateful that some teachers had paid visits to practices, some even exerted strength in making and embellishing the costumes before competitions. In addition, teachers are so anxious about the results after the club had participated in competitions, and shared enthusiasm when they had heard it.

We all hope that the dance club in our school continues to strive for excellence, and not be discouraged when they encounter hindrances. We wish them all the best in their upcoming matches and in pursuing their dreams!

FILM REVIEW - BY LEROY LAI, 5G





PAGE 10 DESSERT RECIPE

Cream brûlée (4 servings)



Equipments:

small containers X1
sift X1
wet towel X1
Burner torch X1
oven (with baking basin)

Ingredient:

Cream 2 cups (500 ml)

Milk 1/2 cup (125ml)

Sugar 1/3 cup (65g)

Egg yolk x4

Vanilla bean x1

Procedures:

- 1) Boil the cream and milk with vanilla bean slowly
- 2) Mix the egg yolk with sugar gently
- 3) Mix the boiled milk with egg yolk, gradually
- 5) Filter the mixture with a sift
- 6) Pour the mixture equally into 4 small containers
- 7) Put a wet towel on a baking basin
- 8) Place the containers on the wet towel
- 9) Fill some hot water in the baking basin
- 10)Put the baking basin in the oven and bake at 300 $^{\circ}$ C for 35 mins.
- 11) After baking, put a thin cover of brown sugar on the surface of the baked Cream brûlée
- 12) Melt the brown sugar layer by using a burner
- 13) Enjoy it!!!



Cats the Musical

THE ULTIMATE, INCREDIBLE MEOW

Cats began its life when the composer Andrew Lloyd Webber was looking for a new challenge. In late 1977, he started thinking about one of his favourite books from his childhood, the Old Possum's Book of Practical Cats by



T. S. Eliot. Cats first opened in the West End in 1981.

SYNOPSIS

The musical starts at midnight, not a sound from the pavement. Suddenly, an explosion of music and lights reveals an enormous junkyard. Jellicle cats reunite to celebrate who they are. The Jellicle cats meet annually at the Jellicle Ball. Victoria, one of the Jellicle cats, dances to signal the invitation to the Jellicle Ball. Old

Deuteronomy, who will be at the ball, will then decide which cat will ascend to the Heaviside Layer and come back to a new life. They sing and dance contentedly. Once Old Deuteronomy arrived to the ball, the cats entertain him with a special show.

Grizabella appears twice, wishing to rejoin and be a part of this cheerful celebration. She is left to contemplate her memory of time before she left the tribe. After the Jellicle Ball, the cats contemplate the movement of happiness. Finally, it's time for Old Deuteronomy to make the 'Jellicle choice' and decide which cat will come back to a new life. Grizabella is chosen to the Heaviside Layer and comes back to a new life.

Cats is an amazing musical play. Every dance is elegant and well-structured. The background is so detailed and realistic, which makes me feel like I'm one of the cats as well. The make-up of each cat and the background is astounding. The adventurous atmosphere and the stimulating songs bring the musical to life.

This striking musical has won tons of awards. In 1981, the Laurence Olivier Award was held, it was awarded as the Best New Musical and Outstanding Achievement in a Musical. In 1983, it was awarded Best Musical, Best Book of a Musical, Best Original Score, Best Direction of a Musical, Best Costume Design, Best Lighting Design in the Tony Awards. I highly recommend everyone to see this musical!
