Sleep well and have enough energy everyday can lower your chance of becoming angry.

The third is to be a volunteer. You can go to visit the elderly person's home, visit the child who has been living in hospital for a long period of time, or help in a walkathon, etc. This may help us to buildup happiness inside our heart. When more happiness is stored inside our heart, it can help us to forgive others or easily overcome difficulties in our lives.

Hope you can find your way to be happy, not just simply wear a smile on your face, but have the kind of joy that comes from the bottom of your heart. For when this is the case, I believe you can then face and overcome the difficulties in your daily life or in your future easily and be at ease.





Everyone has our own decisions for buying things in every democratic society. Shops are places that we can make good use of this freedom. However, have you ever heard or thought that the shops nearby are becoming more and more similar? Mannings, 759 stores, PARKnSHOP, I.T., 7-Eleven, McDonald... Almost all the malls nowadays include these shops. But have you ever thought about the importance of this trend?


First, the monopoly means there is less competition in the market. However, having healthy competition is beneficial for the markets as it would bring more 'merchandise' with better qualities to the citizens. Therefore, a monopoly would bring no improvement to the market and we can't enjoy the 'merchandise' with better qualities. Having "no surprise" for the merchandise would make fewer people want to buy things, thus having less demand and a decline in the selling market. It would denigrate the reputation of "Shopping Paradise" of Hong Kong and negatively affect the future development of Hong Kong.

Second, this phenomenon would also make the price of the merchandise increase and indirectly lead to inflation easily. It is because the merchants have continuous power so they can control the price without having an economic loss. Then, they would mark a higher price for each merchandise. The increase of the merchandise price would increase the economic pressure for us, the Hongkongers. It would increase the negative

emotions towards the rich, affects Hong Kong's development, as well as our daily lives.

Third, the trend of having more chain stores in Hong Kong would make the whole market have less choices. Since the chain stores could attract many customers within a short period of time, the rent for the stores would increase as the renters of the chain stores would not "go away". As a result, the "small shops" would easily go out of business because their profits could not cover the price of rent. Finally, it made the creation of new shops become more difficult and thus more difficult for Hongkongers to become rich by selling.

To conclude, this phenomenon is not good for us. To face these problems, the government plays a vital role. The government should reduce the power of the rich merchants by increasing the profit tax after a certain amount of profit so that the situation of Hong Kong would become more stable for the long term. Also, the government should regulate the prices of the merchandise strictly to prevent the occurrence of serious inflation in Hong Kong. Finally, I hope the Hong Kong government will notice the seriousness of this trend and take action immediately. I am looking forward to it.



Taiwan Cross Strait Agreement

Aung San Suu Kyi has once said: 'Even if you don't care about politics, it will find you'. Recently, Taiwanese students and people from all over the world, even for those who do not usually bother about politics, were demonstrating about the Cross-Strait Service Trade Agreement. They realize that politics may ruin their living, therefore, they start to stand up and fight against it. According to a survey conducted in Taiwan, it shows that 55% and 23% of respondents oppose and support the agreement respectively. To fight against it, 100,000 people protested against it. These protestors are concerned that the agreement will cause economic and social problems such as an increase in unemployment rate in Taiwan. Originally, the protocol was promoted for liberalizing trade in services between Taiwan and mainland China's economy. However, why does it cause numerous complaints and raise the resentments between Taiwan and China?

Under the terms of the treaty, service industries such as banking, healthcare, tourism, film making, telecommunications, and publishing would be opened up for investment. Businessmen would be able to obtain renewable visas of the other territory infinitely. It would be easier for firms to set up offices and branches in the other territory and for large stakes in businesses to be sold to the other party's investors. It sounds ostensibly beneficial for both mainland China and Taiwan that can lead to a win-win situation. Indeed, concerns are emerging that it may cause nothing but harm to Taiwan.

Philippe Maystadt, who is the former President of the European Investment Bank had written, "the competition of Chinese banks is clear. They don't bother about social or human rights conditions". But this is not only for banks. The Taiwanese think Chinese are notorious for their negative image on undergoing developments and transactions. It would only benefit large companies but to devastate small and medium-sized Taiwanese businesses. Chinese investments on the publishing,

mass media and film industry would also threaten the freedom of speech in Taiwan. Eventually, Taiwan and China may be politically unified.

As a conclusion, the conflicts among the Taiwanese themselves and their conflicts with China regarding the Cross-Strait Service Trade Agreement must be solved, as this is just one of the existing problems. It would be nice if everyone could have a serious attitude towards the ongoing political problems and face them squarely to find the best solutions as soon as possible.

No matter if it physically, verbally or online, as long as you do something continuously that hurts another person's feeling it is called bullying.


How do you deal with a bully?

But amidst her growth, she remembered her roots enough to return for a collaboration.

In my opinion, I rather prefer the original version than the cover one, because the singer's voice soars and glides across the notes with ease. Backed by a sympathetic orchestra, you can hear the emotional surge in personal strength through Idina Menzel's glorious voice. Also, the lyrics are powerful and inspirational. Recipe Chocolate Cookies

I believe that almost every person I know loves chocolate cookies. Chocolate cookies must be a part of many people's childhood memory. Let me show you how to make these soft and chewy chocolate cookies today.

Chocolate Cookies

- 21/4 cups all-purpose flour
- ½cup teaspoon baking soda
- 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter (room temp.)
- ½cup granulated sugar
- · 1 cup packed light-brown sugar

- I teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- 2 large eggs
- 2 cups of milk chocolate chips


Step I: Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a small bowl, whisk together the flour and baking soda; set aside. In the bowl of an electric mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, combine both sugars, beat on at medium speed until fluffy. Reduce speed to low; add salt, vanilla extract and eggs. Beat for about I minute until well mixed. Add flour mixture; mix until combined then stir in the chocolate chips.

Step 2: Place heaped tablespoon size balls of dough about 2 inches apart on baking sheets lined with parchment paper.

Step 3: Bake for 8 to 10 minutes until the cookies are golden around the edges, but still soft in the centre. Remove from oven. Let them cool down for 1 to 2 minutes. Store cookies at airtight container at room temperature and they are good for up to one week!
